

Image on the Cover

Christ With Martha and Maria, by Henryk Siemiradzki, 1886.

The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan, which immediately precedes it in Luke's Gospel. Both stories are unique to Luke. The story of the Samaritan opens with the words "a certain man." Today's reading opens with the words "a certain woman." The Samaritan is an example of how a disciple should see and act. Mary is an example of how a disciple should listen. Mary, a woman, is a marginalized person in society, like the Samaritan. Both do what is not expected of them. As a woman, Mary would be expected, like Martha, to prepare hospitality for a guest. Here again Jesus breaks with the social conventions of his time. Just as a Samaritan would not be a model for neighborliness, so a woman would not sit with the men around the feet of a teacher.

Both stories exemplify how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command which begins chapter 10—love of God (Mary) and love of neighbor (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life in the kingdom. By using the examples of a Samaritan and a woman, however, Jesus is saying something more. Social codes and boundaries were strict in Jesus' time. Yet to love God with all one's heart and one's neighbor requires breaking those rules. The Kingdom of God is a society without distinctions and boundaries between its members. It is a society that requires times for seeing and doing and also times for listening and learning at the feet of a teacher.

Amedisys Hospice Care located in Triadelphia, WV is currently in need of volunteers to work with our patients and their families. The Triadelphia care center serves Brooke, Ohio, Marshall, and Wetzel counties. Amedisys Hospice provides physical, emotional, and spiritual support for terminally ill patients and their families.

Volunteers are needed to provide services such as companionship to patients, respite for families and their caregivers and assisting patients with household tasks or errands. Our volunteers also aid with our Bereavement program by making supportive phone calls to family members who have lost a loved one and by helping with Support Groups. There are many ways in which volunteers can assist with our patients and families.

Volunteers must be 16 years of age and have access to transportation. The application process is simple and requires background checks, three personal references and a TB screening, which Amedisys pays for. Our volunteers also need to be vaccinated against COVID-19. All volunteers are trained and supervised by professional Volunteer Coordinators.

In areas of Tennessee where coal-mining operations and landfills have caused water pollution and other environmental damage, Statewide Organizing for Community eMpowerment (SOCM) works with governments and regulatory agencies to limit hazardous waste disposal in landfills and to require environmental cleanup as part of the permitting process for new business operations.

Environmental damage affects all of us, most especially low-income people who are affected by water pollution resulting from mineral extraction, lack of access to healthy foods in urban "food deserts," and natural disasters caused by climate change. The Church teaches that "the natural environment is a collective good, the patrimony of all humanity and the responsibility of everyone" (Pope Francis, Landato Si', no. 95). Since the release of Landato Si' in 2015, CCHD has invested more than \$4.3 million in organizations that work to protect the environment and combat pollution. 




