Background on the Gospel Reading

As This Sunday we break from our reading of Matthew's Gospel (the primary Gospel for our current liturgical cycle, Cycle A) to read from John's Gospel. We heard Matthew's account of Jesus' baptism last Sunday, on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Today, we hear John the Baptist's testimony about Jesus as found in John's Gospel. John's Gospel differs from the other Gospels because John does not describe Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist. Instead, John the Baptist announces that he knows that Jesus is the Son of God.

In today's reading, John the Baptist sees Jesus approaching and cries out, giving witness about who Jesus is. In John's testimony he says that he saw the Spirit descend upon Jesus. By this sign, John the Baptist knew that Jesus was the one who is to come after him.

John the Baptist uses two titles for Jesus that are familiar to us. John calls Jesus the "Lamb of God" and the "Son of God." By using these titles, John the Baptist identifies Jesus' ultimate purpose: to redeem sinful humanity.

John the Baptist's testimony about Jesus clearly distinguishes John's baptism from the Baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John baptizes with water; Jesus will baptize with the Holy Spirit. John also puts his practice of baptism in the context of Jesus' ministry. The purpose of John's baptism was to make Jesus known to Israel.

John the Baptist's sense of purpose is clearly identified in this reading: he baptized in order to prepare for and make known the ministry of the One who was to follow. John's witness is an excellent example of what it means to be a disciple. By our Baptism, we are called to make Jesus known to all the world by our words and by the witness of our lives.

What is the Church Year or the Liturgical Year?

The liturgical year is the arrangement of the Church's celebrations of the various events in the life of Christ and the mysteries of our faith throughout the year. In other words, it is "the celebration throughout the year of the mysteries of the Lord's birth, life, death, and Resurrection in such a way that the entire year becomes a 'year of the Lord's grace.' Thus, the cycle of the liturgical year and the great feasts constitutes the basic rhythm of the Christian's life of prayer, with its focal point at Easter" (CCC #1168). This cycle is the temporal structure within which the Church celebrates the holy mysteries of Christ: "From the Incarnation and the Nativity to the Ascension, to Pentecost and to the wait in joyful hope for the Lord's coming" Each liturgical season is distinguished by its own mood, theological emphasis, mode of prayer, vestments for clergy, and readings for the Mass, each of which help the faithful to enter more deeply into the life of Christ.

In the Latin rite, it consists of six liturgical seasons: Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time after Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time after Pentecost. Advent begins on the Sunday closest to the feast of St. Andrew, which is November 30th. The liturgical colors of Advent are Purple and Rose, with Rose being used only on the third Sunday (Gaudete Sunday). The Christmas season begins with the celebration of the birth of Jesus on the vigil of Christmas Eve. The Ordinary Time begins after the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The Ordinary Time after the Baptism focuses on the early life and childhood of Christ, and then on His public ministry. The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green although blue is typically worn for Marian feast days, red on the feast days of martyrs and white on the feast days of other saints. The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts until Holy Saturday. Lent is a penitential season. The liturgical colors of Lent are violet or purple except on the third week (Laetare Sunday) when rose color is used. The joyous and celebratory Easter season begins with the Easter Vigil and ends by celebrating the Pentecost or the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus. The second Ordinary Time begins the day after Pentecost and extends through the final day before Advent. This is the longest liturgical season. The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green, although other appropriate colors are worn on particular feast days. The final Sunday in Ordinary Time (34th Sunday) is the Feast of Christ the King.

Ordinary Time after the Baptism: Monday after the Feast of the Baptism through Shrove Tuesday: After the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, Ordinary Time begins. Ordinary does not mean plain. The name comes from "ordinalis" meaning "showing order, denoting an order of succession." It is used in this sense to refer to the order of the counted weeks. That is to say, it is a season of numbered weeks. Ordinary Time after the Baptism focuses on the early life and childhood of Christ, and then on His public ministry.


