Lenten Reflection

Pope Francis tells us that Lent is a new beginning, a path toward continual conversion of the heart. We invite you to join the local parochial schools in this journey of prayer and reflection. Background on the Gospel Reading

The last two antitheses offered in the Sermon on the Mount deal with love of enemies. We should not look at "an eye for an eye" as an inordinately strict punishment. It is actually meant to limit acts of revenge by making sure the punishment is not excessive but fits the crime. However, Jesus asks his followers to take a different approach by resisting retaliation altogether. The response to a stronger person who slaps us on the cheek, takes us to court, or demands a service of us is not to resist. Similarly, for a weaker person, such as a beggar or borrower, we are to give him or her what he or she asks for. Those who are called to the Kingdom of Heaven are to go beyond the way the world usually works and serve God's kingdom here on earth.

The other difficult demand of those who are called to the kingdom is to embrace the enemy. There is no command in the Old Testament to hate individuals in a personal or vindictive way. But there is a religious stance that calls one to hate evil and to distance oneself from those who participate in evil. In contrast, Matthew emphasizes that love of God and love of neighbor are the fundamental commands on which all else depend. Because God's love is unconditional, we are to strive to love as God does, though, of course, it is challenging. Is it even possible?

The key is in the final verse. We are to be perfect as our heavenly father is perfect. Matthew uses the Greek word telos, which is probably better translated here as "complete." We are not to be perfect as in doing everything correctly, that is, as in being absolutely morally correct. We are to be perfect as in striving to reach the completeness we are called to in the Kingdom of Heaven. Attempting to love our enemies is part of striving for that completeness.



LENT

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

<u>FASTING DAYS</u>: include Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (one full meatless meal is permitted), and meatless Fridays during Lent (fish and shellfish are permitted).

<u>THE THREE PILLARS:</u> of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. In addition to fasting, many also choose to abstain from other comforts during Lent.

<u>HOLY WEEK:</u> begins with Palm Sunday, April 2nd, a celebration of Christ's triumphant return to Jerusalem.

<u>EASTER TRIDUUM:</u> begins with Holy Thursday, April 6, at Sunset, signaling the end of the Lenten season.

Spiritual Exercises & Question of the Week

LENTEN ACTIVITIES & SPIRITUAL EXERCISES!

- Attend one extra Mass per week.
- Spend at least 30 minutes in Eucharistic adoration per week.
- Go to confession at least once during the season of Lent after making a good examination of conscience.
- Make a decision to read some Scripture every day during Lent.
- Attend the Stations of the Cross each Friday during the Season of Lent. If you have children, bring them!
- Pray the Rosary often during Lent. If you've never done a family rosary, begin doing it.
- Lenten fasting and abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and all Fridays of the lent are days of abstinence.
- Works of mercy for lent: Find a local homeless shelter, soup kitchen, or crisis pregnancy center, and volunteer some time there throughout Lent. Visit someone who is sick at home, in the hospital or at a nursing home.
- Pray each day during Lent for the intentions and health of the Holy Father. Pray each day for your bishop and all the bishops of the Catholic Church, for your priests and deacons, for the millions of Christians suffering under persecution.
- Almsgiving: Help someone make their life better.
- Refocus your priorities for lent: If you are married, it would be an awesome Lenten idea to spend some special, focused time with your spouse, strengthening your marriage. Start praying together or make praying together a more frequent occurrence. Spend some focused time together with each of your children, or your siblings, or your parents.



Question of the Week

Why do we observe Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday (dies cinereum), is the Church's Yom Kippur or the "Day of Atonement." Its very name comes from the Jewish practice of doing penance wearing "sackcloth and ashes." The Old Testament tells us how the people of Nineveh, the Syrian King, Ben Hadad, and Queen Esther fasted wearing sackcloth and ashes. The priest dipping his thumb into ashes marks the forehead of each with the sign of the cross, saying the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return" or "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

The ashen cross gives us a firm conviction that: **a)** we are mortal beings, and **b)** our life-span is very brief and unpredictable. It also gives us a strong warning that we will be eternally punished if we do not repent of our sins and do penance. Ash Wednesday reminds us that we need to purify and renew our lives during the period of Lent by repentance, which means expressing sorrow for sins by turning away from occasions of sins and going straight to God.

We need to express our repentance by getting reconciled with God daily, by asking for forgiveness from those whom we have offended and by giving unconditional forgiveness to our neighbors who have offended us. It also challenges us to do prayerful fasting and little acts of penance for our sins, following the example of Jesus before his public ministry.

Help Needed for Food Packing Event!

The Wheeling-area Knights of Columbus, in collaboration with Cross Catholic Outreach, are working together to address hunger related causes.

On Saturday April 15th, 2023, a Food Packing event will be held from 8:00 am until approximately 12:00 **noon** at the Wheeling University Alma Grace McDonough Center auxiliary gymnasium.

Our plan is to pack 60,000 nutritious vita-meals on that day to help alleviate world hunger. 90% of the meals packed will go to places such as Dominican Republic and Guatemala, while 10% of the meals will be

Since inception a few years ago these West Virginia Knights of Columbus/Cross Catholic food packing events have resulted in feeding over 440,000 people. packed state-wide, a significant accomplishment!

To accomplish this task we are in need of volunteers and donations. It will take approximately 125 volunteers working over a 4-5 hour period to finish the job. Volunteers are invited to participate from local parish and church organizations, school students, and civic-minded organizations. No skills are necessary – only a desire to serve others. All ages are welcome but parental consent is required for volunteers under the age of 18. Volunteer groups are welcome and encouraged.

Most importantly, donations are needed! Contributions will enable us to purchase supplies needed to accomplish our goal. At 33 cents per meal we will need to raise approximately \$20,000 to provide 60,000 meals. Any additional funds will enable us to pack even more meals.




FOOD HANDLERS CLASSES




