

Gospel Reflection & Prayer List

Background on the Gospel Reading

As we did last week, we are reading today from the Gospel of John. In today's Gospel, the healing of the man born blind invites us to focus on the physical and spiritual aspects of sight and light. In the first part of today's Gospel, we hear Jesus' response to a prevalent belief of his time: that misfortune and disability were the result of sin. That belief is why Jesus is asked the question of whose sin caused the man's blindness—his own or his parents'. Jesus does not answer directly, but instead gives the question an entirely different dimension—through this man's disability, God's power will be made manifest. Jesus then heals the man.

The healing is controversial because Jesus heals on the Sabbath. The Pharisees, the religious authorities of Jesus' time, understood that the law of Moses forbade work (including healing) on the Sabbath. They also have trouble believing that Jesus performed a miracle. To determine whether the man was really born blind, the Pharisees question him and his parents. The man challenges the leaders of the synagogue about their assessment of the good that Jesus has done. In turn, they expel the man for questioning their judgment.

The final revelation and moment of enlightenment comes when the man born blind encounters Jesus again. Having heard the news of his expulsion, Jesus seeks out the man born blind and reveals himself to him as the Son of Man. In this moment, the man born blind shows himself to be a man of faith and worships Jesus. Jesus replies by identifying the irony of the experience of many who encounter Jesus: Those who are blind will now see, and those who think they now see will be found to be blind.

As in last week's Gospel about Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman, today's reading has many allusions to Baptism. The washing of the man in the pool of Siloam is a prototype for Christian Baptism. Through the man's encounter with Jesus, the man born blind is healed, his sight is restored, and his conversion to discipleship begins. The man born blind gradually comes to a greater understanding about who Jesus is and what it means to be his disciple, while the Pharisees (those who should see) are the ones who remain blind.

LENT

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

<u>FASTING DAYS</u>: include **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** (one full meatless meal is permitted), and meatless Fridays during Lent (fish and shellfish are permitted).

<u>THE THREE PILLARS:</u> of Lent are **prayer**, **fasting** and **almsgiving**. In addition to fasting, many also choose to abstain from other comforts during Lent.

<u>HOLY WEEK:</u> begins with **Palm Sunday**, April 2nd, a celebration of Christ's triumphant return to Jerusalem.

EASTER TRIDUUM: begins with **Holy Thursday**, on April 6, at Sunset, signaling the end of the Lenten season.

LIVE LENT BOOK STUDY

Lenten Season

Question of the Week & Spiritual Exercises

Why should we tithe?

Is there any biblical stipulation on tithing? What % (percentage) of a family's income?

Biblical basis of stewardship by tithing: Both the Old and the New Testaments are full of references to tithing to the Lord. The practice of tithing is rooted in the Old Testament and was reinforced by the teaching of Jesus and his apostles and the example of the early Christians. The tithe was basically a requirement of the Mosaic Law by which all Israelites were to give 10% of everything they earned and grew, to the tabernacle.

Genesis 14:18-20: Abraham first gave a tithe offering as a spontaneous thank you to God. / Genesis 28:22: Jacob makes a pledge to return one tenth of everything he has to the Lord. / Leviticus 27:30: "All tithes of the land, whether in grain from the fields or in fruit from the trees, belong to the LORD, as sacred to Him." / Malachi 3:10: "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house, and try me in this, says the LORD of hosts: Shall I not open for you the floodgates of heaven, to pour down blessing upon you without measure?" (Cfr also Num 18:26; Deut 14:24; 2Chr 31:5).

Jesus encouraged the generous sharing of our blessings with others: "Give and gifts will be given to you" (Luke 6:38). / St. Paul exhorts the Christians in Corinth to contribute "what they can afford" to support the ministry of the Church. (1Cor 16:1-4). / The early Christian community took Jesus literally when he told the rich young man to sell all he had and give it to the poor. The early Church practiced it as evidenced in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:45): "they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's need,".

Theologically, tithing is an act of thanksgiving to God by which we are helping our own brothers and sisters in the parish community. Besides, it is a source and means of additional blessing from God.

LENTEN ACTIVITIES & SPIRITUAL EXERCISES!

- Attend one extra Mass per week.
- Spend at least 30 minutes in Eucharistic adoration per week.
- Go to confession at least once during the season of Lent after making a good examination of conscience.
- Make a decision to read some Scripture every day during Lent.
- Attend the Stations of the Cross each Friday during the Season of Lent. If you have children, bring them!
- Pray the Rosary often during Lent. If you've never done a family rosary, begin doing it.
- Lenten fasting and abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and all Fridays of the lent are days of abstinence.
- Works of mercy for lent: Find a local homeless shelter, soup kitchen, or crisis pregnancy center, and volunteer some time there throughout Lent. Visit someone who is sick at home, in the hospital or at a nursing home.
- Pray each day during Lent for the intentions and health of the Holy Father. Pray each day for your bishop and all the bishops of the Catholic Church, for your priests and deacons, for the millions of Christians suffering under persecution.
- Almsgiving: Help someone make their life better.
- Refocus your priorities for lent: If you are married, it would be an awesome Lenten idea to spend some special, focused time with your spouse, strengthening your marriage. Start praying together or make praying together a more frequent occurrence. Spend some focused time together with each of your children, or your siblings, or your parents.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul - Outreach in 2022

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul - St. Mary's Conference, Elm Grove has had a busy and productive year of service in 2022. We were able to help **1019 individuals** and we made **310 home visits** (a hallmark of our Society.) Society members and friends, all lay volunteers, gave a reported **939 hours of service** and an estimated **3,000 driving miles** to assist the Society in its work.

We were able to give \$39,239 in assistance to those we serve - anyone in need, for whatever reason, in our local community area. Our bed ministry also continues to be successful. With beds donated by hotel/motel operations, college/university sources, individual donations and beds purchased directly with donations, we provided 171 beds to families in need. We were able to accomplish this with the much appreciated help of our volunteer truck drivers and their families and friends. This has been a way to encourage young people to become involved in service.

We continue to reach out to other local parishes for financial assistance and prospective members. We have had four new members join the Society this year! In accordance with our Rule and with the help of WV and National trainers, we provided an Orientation and training session for them and as a refresher for current members. We now have 13 active members and 5 associate members.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul's outreach depends upon volunteers and donations. The Church community has always been generous in providing both. Poor box collections, Thrift Store distributions, Grants, individual donations, and member contributions make up the bulk of our financial resources. Over ninety-six per cent of the funds we receive goes directly to those we serve! The remainder is used to maintain our phone line, liability insurance and for other supplies.
