Gospel Reflection & Prayer List

Background on the Gospel Reading

For the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert to his Transfiguration. Each year on the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. On the second Sunday of Lent each year, we hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration.

The story of Jesus' Transfiguration is told in the three Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In each of those Gospels, the Transfiguration follows Jesus' first prediction of his death and his teaching about the costs of discipleship. Jesus' Transfiguration is a promise of Jesus' glory, his Resurrection.

On a mountain in today's reading, a voice affirms that Jesus is God's Son in words reminiscent of the voice at Jesus' baptism. In addition, the appearance of Moses and Elijah on the mountain connects this story with God's relationship to the people of Israel. Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets, respectively. Together with Jesus, they represent God's complete Word.

The Transfiguration occurs in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples: Peter, James, and John. In Matthew's Gospel, those disciples are among the first whom Jesus calls. The three men are identified as an "inner circle" among Jesus' disciples when Jesus asks them to accompany him to the Garden of Gethsemane just before his arrest.

<u>Distribution of the Sacred Cup, Sign of Peace to be Reinstated!</u>

This is an excerpt from a letter released by Bishop Mark E. Brennan.

After much prayerful discernment and consultation with members of the medical community, I am reinstating the distribution of the Sacred Cup to the faithful who wish to receive it **effective April 6**, **2023**. This date is most appropriate as it is Holy Thursday, when we recall that our Lord Jesus first gave the Church this precious gift of His Body and His Blood at the Last Supper.

Another part of our sacred liturgy that has been deeply affected by the COVID-19 pandemic is the Sign of Peace. If you recall, prior to the pandemic we were encouraged to greet those around us with a handshake or a gentle embrace. I have decided to allow both "tactile" and "non-tactile" gestures.

LENT

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

<u>FASTING DAYS:</u> include Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (one full meatless meal is permitted), and meatless Fridays during Lent (fish and shellfish are permitted).

THE THREE PILLARS: of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. In addition to fasting, many also choose to abstain from other comforts during Lent.

HOLY WEEK: begins with Palm Sunday, April 2nd, a celebration of Christ's triumphant return to Jerusalem.

EASTER TRIDUUM: begins with Holy Thursday, on April 6, at Sunset, signaling the end of the Lenten season.

A Lenten Study is planned for each Tuesday during Lent. The book "Live Lent" by Sr. Theresa Rickard O.P. will be our guide and reference. Facilitators are Bryan & Maria Minor and Dave Soloninka.

Lenten Mission with Bishop Waltersheid

The Most Reverend William J. Waltersheid, V.G., S.T.L., Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, will lead a three-night Lenten Mission at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Wheeling, WV on March 5th, 6th, and 7th beginning each evening at 6:00 p.m.

The theme for the Lenten Mission is "The Holy Eucharist: The Source of Our Life, Salvation, and Mission". A mission is a wonderful way to encounter Jesus and deepen or reawaken our faith with special talks, prayer, music, and reflection. There will also be the opportunity for confessions. Everyone is invited!



Lenten Season

Question of the Week & Spiritual Exercises

Why are fasting, penance and prayer are recommended during Lent?

Fasting during Lent: reduces our "spiritual obesity" or the excessive accumulation of fat in our soul in the form of evil tendencies and evil habits. 1) It gives us additional moral and spiritual strength and encourages us to share our blessings with the needy people. 2) Fasting also gives us more time to be with God in prayer.

3) We need to do prayerful fasting and acts of penance for our sins, following the example of Jesus before his public ministry. 4) When we fast, we are imitating the people of Nineveh and the Syrian King, Ben Hadad who fasted pleading for God's mercy and forgiveness, and Queen Esther who fasted for her people.

Acts of penance during Lent, 1) remove the weakness left by sin in our souls and give us more self control, 2) pay the temporary debt caused by sin, and 3) make our prayers more fruitful. Besides, it is Jesus' teaching: "If any one wishes to follow me, let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow me."

<u>Prayer is necessary at all times</u>, because God has commanded it, and because, without it, we do not receive the graces necessary to persevere to the end. "It is necessary for adults as a means of salvation; that is to say, that a person who does not pray, and neglects to ask of God the help requisite for overcoming temptations, and for preserving grace already received, cannot be saved." (St. Alphonsus - CCC 2744).

In essence, prayer is talking to God and listening to Him. Jesus gives us the model of penitential prayer by his forty days in the desert in preparation for his public life. Prayer during the Lent Season,

- Unites us to God;
- Makes us heavenly minded;
- Strengthens us against evil;
- Gives us zeal and energy for good;
- Comforts us in adversity; and
- Obtains help for us in time of need, and the grace of perseverance unto death.

LENTEN ACTIVITIES & SPIRITUAL EXERCISES!

- Attend one extra Mass per week.
- Spend at least 30 minutes in Eucharistic adoration per week.
- Go to confession at least once during the season of Lent after making a good examination of conscience.
- Make a decision to read some Scripture every day during Lent.
- Attend the Stations of the Cross each Friday during the Season of Lent. If you have children, bring them!
- Pray the Rosary often during Lent. If you've never done a family rosary, begin doing it.
- Lenten fasting and abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and all Fridays of the lent are days of abstinence.
- Works of mercy for lent: Find a local homeless shelter, soup kitchen, or crisis pregnancy center, and volunteer some time there throughout Lent. Visit someone who is sick at home, in the hospital or at a nursing home.
- Pray each day during Lent for the intentions and health of the Holy Father. Pray each day for your bishop and all the bishops of the Catholic Church, for your priests and deacons, for the millions of Christians suffering under persecution.
- Almsgiving: Help someone make their life better.
- Refocus your priorities for lent: If you are married, it would be an awesome Lenten idea to spend some special, focused time with your spouse, strengthening your marriage. Start praying together or make praying together a more frequent occurrence. Spend some focused time together with each of your children, or your siblings, or your parents.


