## Prayer & Worship

Gospel Reflection & Weekly Themes

#### **Background on the Gospel Reading**

Today's liturgy invites us to celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This feast calls to our attention the importance of this event in Jesus' life, further affirmed by its report in each of the Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In Cycle A, the reading for this feast is taken from the Gospel of Matthew. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter confesses his belief that Jesus is the Messiah and after Jesus predicts his Passion. In each of these Gospels, a discussion of the cost of discipleship precedes the Transfiguration.

In each Gospel, Jesus takes three of his disciples—Peter, James, and John—to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear and converse with Jesus. Elijah and Moses are both significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and received from Yahweh the Ten Commandments. Moses represents the Law, which guides the lives of the Jewish people. Elijah is one of the most important prophets of Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to Yahweh, and some believed that Elijah's return would signal the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people. The appearance of these two figures from Israel's history indicated Jesus' continuity with the Law and the prophets. They also reveal that Jesus is the fulfillment of all that was promised to the people of Israel.

Upon witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, an awestruck Peter offered to construct three tents for them when a voice from Heaven affirms that Jesus is "my beloved Son" and commands the disciples to listen to him.

In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructed the disciples to keep secret what they had seen until after "the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." Until they witnessed Jesus' Passion and Death, the disciples could not possibly understand what he meant by being "raised from the dead." We, however, have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of the Transfiguration Gospel, we see an anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection, a foreshadowing of Christ's glory in Heaven, and the promise of our own resurrection.

#### Themes for the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

The Transfiguration also offers us a foretaste of heaven, where we will behold God face to face in all of His glory. In our earthly journey, we often struggle to grasp the fullness of God's presence and the reality of the afterlife. However, the Transfiguration reminds us that one day, in heaven, we will experience the radiant splendor of God's divine presence. Like the apostles on Mount Tabor, we too will witness the glory of the Risen Christ, which will surpass anything we can currently comprehend.

The Feast of the Transfiguration calls us to embrace the call to holiness. As we contemplate the glorified Christ, we are invited to renew our commitment to living lives of virtue and grace. Just as the apostles were transformed by their encounter with the transfigured Christ, we are called to be transfigured by our encounter with Him in the Eucharist and through prayer. This transformation is an ongoing process, as we seek to become more like Christ and reflect His light to the world.

The Feast of the Transfiguration is a profound celebration of Jesus' divine nature and His ultimate triumph over sin and death. As we meditate on this event, we are reminded of the heavenly glory that awaits us and the transformative power of encountering Christ in our lives. Let us strive to follow the example of Peter, James, and John, embracing the call to holiness and allowing Christ's light to shine through us, so that others may also catch a glimpse of the glory that awaits those who faithfully follow Him. May the Feast of the Transfiguration inspire us to draw closer to Christ and become bearers of His love and light in the world.

<u>The Transfiguration of Jesus</u>: The gospel describe the moment when Jesus is transfigured before His disciples on a mountain, revealing His divine glory and reinforcing His identity as the Son of God.

<u>The Presence of Moses and Elijah</u>: During the Transfiguration, Moses and Elijah appear and speak with Jesus, representing the Law and the Prophets, and affirming Jesus' fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies and His authority.

<u>Peter's Response and Revelation</u>: Peter's reaction to the Transfiguration shows his awe and desire to commemorate the event, highlighting the disciples' struggle to fully comprehend Jesus' divine nature.

<u>God's Voice from the Cloud</u>: God's voice affirms Jesus as His beloved Son and commands the disciples to listen to Him, underscoring Jesus' unique role as God's chosen Messiah and the authoritative source of divine revelation.

<u>Secrecy and Timing</u>: Jesus instructs the disciples not to reveal the Transfiguration until after His resurrection, indicating the importance of timing and the gradual unveiling of His identity and mission.

<u>Confirmation of Jesus' Identity</u>: The Transfiguration serves as a significant confirmation of Jesus' identity as the Son of God, preparing the disciples for the challenges ahead and strengthening their faith.

## Question of the Week

What are the names of Jesus in Aramaic, Hebrew, Greek & Latin?

Names are very, very important. When you call someone out by their name, it's kind of a big deal. Calling someone by their name indicates that you know them—and also that you know **who** they are.

The proper name **Jesus** used in the English language originates from the Latin form **<u>Iesus</u>** of the Greek name *Iēsous* (Ἰησοῦς) which was later abbreviated to **IHS**.

The original Hebrew name was **Yehoshua** or <u>Yeshu</u>a (ישועי) meaning "God is salvation" or "God rescues," with variants *Joshua* or *Jeshua*. During the post-Biblical period the further shortened form <u>Yeshu</u> was adopted by Aramaic and Hebrew speaking Jews to refer to the Christian Jesus. However **Yehoshua** continued to be used for the other people called Jesus.

The people of the South Palestine called Jesus <u>Yiso</u> (Yeeso) and those Jews in the North Palestine called him <u>Yeshu</u> during his life time. "Yet to all who received him, to those <u>who believed in his [Jesus'] name</u>, he gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12, NIV). "And this is his command: to <u>believe in the</u> name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us." (1 John 3:23, NIV).

In the Catholic Church all the sacraments are administered in Jesus' name and most prayers begin and conclude in Jesus' name showing us the importance attached to the name Jesus. Mark 16:17, "And these signs shall follow them that believe; <u>In my name shall</u> they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues."


#### **Bed Ministry**




