"It is better to give than receive." This Catholic lay organization leads women and men to join together to service those who are needy and suffering.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul - St. Mary's Conference - Elm Grove has had another busy and productive year of service in 2023! We were able to help **1,048** individuals and we made **326** home visits (a hallmark of the Society). Society members and friends, all lay volunteers, gave a reported **1,083** hours of service and an estimated **2,872** driving miles to assist the Society in its work.

We were able to give \$39,627 in assistance to those we serve anyone in need, for whatever reason, in our local community area. Our bed ministry continues to be successful! With beds donated by hotel/motel operations, college/university sources, individual donations and beds purchased directly with donations, we provided 264 beds to families in need. We were able to accomplish this with the much appreciated help of our volunteer truck drivers and their families and friends. Recently we have been blessed to have the help of local high school students who generously help us on weekends, making it easier to deliver more beds at once. This gives the students an opportunity to do service and learn about the Society. Our local Conference currently has 14 active members and 5 associate members. We had 2 new members this year. We also have 32 non-Vincentian members, 20 of whom are new. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul's outreach depends upon volunteers and donations. The Church community has always been generous in providing both. Poor box collections, Thrift Store distributions, Grants, individual donations and member contributions make up the bulk of our financial resources. Ninety-seven percent of the funds we receive goes directly to those we serve! The remainder is used to maintain our phone line and for liability insurance and other supplies. The services we provide include food vouchers to Riesbeck's Food Market, assistance with rent and utilities, personal care and cleaning supplies, gasoline, beds and linens and other services to empower those in need.

We deeply appreciate the on-going support of our community! Be assured of the gratitude and prayers of our Society members and those we serve. We ask that you continue to be a part of our Society through your prayers and financial donations. If you feel called to join the Society, you would be most welcome! Themes for the 5th Sunday of Lent Year B

The readings for the 5th Sunday of Lent for Year B focus on God's covenant with us, even though we are often unfaithful. The first reading speaks of a new covenant. The second reading speaks of the obedience of Jesus Christ brought about our salvation. And in the gospel Jesus foretells his death and explains that those who follow him will find eternal life.

The Mass readings for the 5th Sunday of Lent Year B revolve around several interconnected themes that highlight the transformative nature of faith, the fulfillment of God's promises, and the path to eternal life through sacrifice and obedience. Here are the main themes:

New Covenant and Inner Transformation: The first reading from Jeremiah speaks of a new covenant that God will establish with His people. Unlike the old covenant, which was external and often broken, this new covenant will be written on their hearts, symbolizing an intimate and unbreakable relationship with God. It emphasizes God's mercy and the transformative power of His law within us.

Obedience Through Suffering: The second reading from Hebrews presents Jesus as the model of obedience and submission to God's will, even in the face of suffering. It highlights the idea that true obedience to God can involve hardship and pain but leads to greater wisdom and fulfillment of God's plan for salvation.

Death and Resurrection: The Gospel according to John introduces the metaphor of a grain of wheat that must die to produce life, illustrating the necessary passage through death to reach the fullness of life. This theme is central to the Lenten journey, pointing towards Jesus' death and resurrection as the path to new life for all believers.

<u>Self-Denial and Service</u>: Jesus' teachings on self-denial and the importance of serving others are key themes in the Gospel. He emphasizes that following Him requires a willingness to let go of personal desires and ambitions in favor of a life dedicated to serving God and others.

<u>Universal Salvation</u>: Jesus' statement about drawing all people to Himself upon being lifted up from the earth speaks to the universal nature of His mission. His death and resurrection are not just for a select few but offer salvation to all who believe in Him, transcending cultural and religious boundaries.

Divine Assurance and Human Response: The divine voice affirming Jesus' mission and the varied responses from the crowd illustrate the theme of faith and doubt. It highlights the challenges believers face in understanding and accepting the mysteries of faith, as well as the assurance that God's plan is being fulfilled through Jesus.

These themes for the 5th Sunday of Lent Year B guide the faithful towards a deeper understanding of God's love and salvation plan, encouraging a personal and communal transformation that aligns with the heart of the Lenten season.

HOLY WEEK

Palm Sunday

Sunday before Easter. Celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Observed with palm branches, parades, and celebration.



Holy Thursday

Thursday before Easter. Commemorates the Last Supper. Often observed with foot washing, stripping of the altar, and overnight prayer vigil to keep watch with Jesus in the aarden.





Good Friday

Friday before Easter. Most solemn day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified. Observed by praying the Stations of the Cross and three hours of silent prayer while Jesus was on the cross.

Holy Saturday

Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.



Easter Sunday

Hallelujah! Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.

HAND-MADE RELIGIOUS ARTICLES

We are delighted to invite you to see and purchase handmade religious articles made by the Sisters of St. Elisabeth Convent (Belarus). The exposition will take place on the Tuesday, April 16th, Wednesday, April 17th, and Thursday, April 18th after the Masses.

Sisterhood of St. Elisabeth was founded in 1996. Our missionary began in National mental hospital located not far from the Convent. Sisters take care of mentally challenged children and adults. Life of the child with diagnoses such as Down syndrome, birth traumas or congenital physical defects may be quite short and it is painful to see them suffering. Also, the adult patients need constant support owing to the fact that their illnesses make it impossible for them to adapt socially.

In the recent years a shelter and house of Labor for former drug and alcohol addicted people was organized 20 miles away from the Convent. A lot of homeless, struggling and lost people get a chance for new start in life to find the God.

In order to help these people some workshops were organized on the premises of the Convent where vulnerable people have a possibility to express themselves in art for God working together with nuns and sisters and making icons (including hand painted), crosses, crucifixes, wood carvings, embroidered and ceramic gifts, rosaries and vestments. All these goods made with love and prayer bring blessings to their owners.

We are happy and thanking God for the opportunity to introduce and offer them to you.

WAYS TO PRAY DURING LENT

What do we do when we're facing an upcoming big event, celebration, or special occasion in our lives? We prepare for it. Holy Week and Easter are "big events" in the liturgical year of the Church and in the spiritual life of a Christian. So, as Christians, we prepare spiritually for these through the forty days of Lent. This means that, during Lent, we rededicate ourselves to prayer.

There are as many ways to pray as there are pray-ers in this world, but a few prayer methods can help us in particular to spiritually prepare ourselves during Lent:

Reflect deeper on your liturgical praver:

When you attend Mass during Lent, be conscious of and meditate on the words you pray in the liturgy. For example, the Eucharistic Prayer, the highlight of each Mass, has special significance during Lent. After receiving communion, you may want to sit and reflect more deeply on this great prayer of the Church.

Why fasting, penance and prayer are recommended during Lent?

1) Fasting reduces our "spiritual obesity" or the excessive accumulation of fat in our soul in the form of evil tendencies and evil habits.

2) It gives us additional moral and spiritual strength and encourages us to share our blessings with the needy people.3) Fasting also gives us more time to be with God in prayer.

4) We need to do prayerful fasting and acts of penance for our sins, following the example of Jesus before his public ministry.

5) When we fast, we are imitating the people of Nineveh and the Syrian King, Ben Hadad who fasted pleading for God's mercy and forgiveness, and Queen Esther who fasted for her people.

Acts of penance during Lent:

a) remove the weakness left by sin in our souls and give us more self control,

b) pay the temporary debt caused by sin, and

c) make our prayers more fruitful. Besides, it is Jesus' teaching: "If any one wishes to follow me, let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow me."

Prayer is necessary at all times because God has commanded it, and because, without it, we do not receive the graces necessary to persevere to the end. "It is necessary for adults as a means of salvation; that is to say, that a person who does not pray, and neglects to ask of God the help requisite for overcoming temptations, and for preserving grace already received, cannot be saved." (St. Alphonsus - CCC 2744).

In essence, prayer is talking to God and listening to Him. Jesus gives us the model of penitential prayer by his forty days in the desert in preparation for his public life.

Prayer during the Lent:

- 1. Unites us to God;
- 2. Makes us heavenly minded;
- 3. Strengthens us against evil;
- 4. Gives us zeal and energy for good;
- 5. Comforts us in adversity; and
- 6. Obtains help for us in time of need, and the grace of perseverance unto death.

Why should we participate in the Holy Week liturgy?

It is on Palm Sunday that we enter Holy Week, and welcome Jesus into our lives, asking him to allow us a share in his suffering, death and resurrection. This is also the time we remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation.

That is why the Holy Week liturgy presents us with the actual events of the dying and rising of Jesus.

The liturgy also enables us to experience in our lives, here and now, what Jesus went through then. In other words, we commemorate and relive during this week our own dying and rising in Jesus, which result in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption.

No wonder Greek Orthodox Christians greet each other with the words, "Kali Anastasi" (Good Resurrection), not on Easter Sunday but on Good Friday. They anticipate the resurrection.

Just as Jesus did, we, too, must lay down our lives freely by actively participating in the Holy Week liturgies. In doing so, we are allowing Jesus to forgive us our sins, to heal the wounds in us caused by our sins and the sins of others and to transform us more completely into the image and likeness of God. Thus, we shall be able to live more fully the divine life we received at Baptism.

Proper participation in the Holy Week liturgy will also deepen our relationship with God, increase our faith and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus. But let us remember that Holy Week can become "holy" for us only if we actively and consciously take part in the liturgies of this week. This is also the week when we should lighten the burden of Christ's passion as daily experienced by the hungry, the poor, the sick, the homeless, the lonely and the outcast through our corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

SVDP - A LOOK AHEAD...

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to certain devotion. <u>The month of March is known as the</u> <u>Month of St. Joseph</u>. While May is traditionally dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Catholic Church, March is dedicated to Mary's spouse, St. Joseph.

With the solemn feast of St. Joseph falling on March 19th in the Church's liturgical year, Catholics celebrate St. Joseph's Day even when it falls during the season of Lent as it did this year. However, another saint, St. Patrick, gets a lot more media attention in our country than St. Joseph.

During his life on earth, St. Joseph stayed in the background and served Mary and Jesus as their protector and provider. Aside from the infancy narratives in Matthew and Luke's Gospels, little is known about St. Joseph except that he was a carpenter/craftsman. Scholars say St. Joseph probably died between the years of Jesus being found in the Temple and the start of his public ministry. While devotion to Mary flourished in the early Church, devotion to St. Joseph did not really develop until the 17th and 18th centuries when religious congregations helped promote St. Joseph as a patron and intercessor.
