



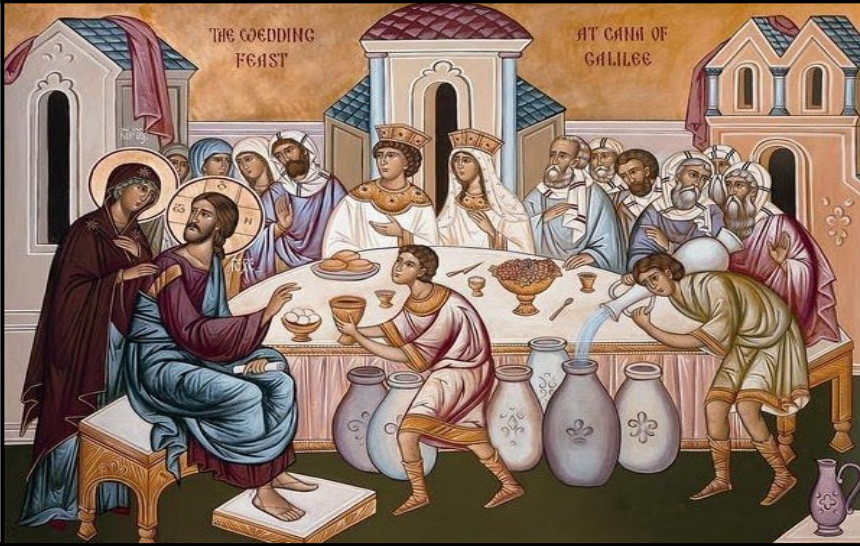

The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C - January 19th, 2025



First Reading - Isaiah 62:1-5

For the sake of Zion and Jerusalem, I will speak until their righteousness shines. Nations will see their glory. The Lord will rejoice over them as a bridegroom rejoices over his bride.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 96:1-2,2-3,7-8,9-10

Sing to the Lord, proclaim his salvation, and declare his wonders. Give him glory, worship him, and say to the nations: The Lord is king who rules with justice.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

The same Spirit gives different gifts to each person for the benefit of all, such as wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discernment, tongues, and their interpretation.

Gospel Reading - John 2:1-11

At a wedding in Cana, Jesus turned water into wine after his mother informed him of the shortage. This miracle revealed his glory and led his disciples to believe in him.

The Book of Signs:

Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him. John 2:11

John's Gospel is commonly divided into four sections: the Prologue, the Book of Signs, the Book of Glory and the Epilogue (which contains the resurrection appearance in Galilee). Today's Gospel comes from the beginning of the Book of Signs, which begins at Chapter 1:19 and continues through Chapter 12. In this section, the Apostle John presents us with seven "signs," which are seven miracles Jesus performed. Each sign has a deeper spiritual meaning that reveals Jesus' divinity and mission. In many ways, the entire Book of Signs prepares us for the Book of Glory in which Jesus' "hour" of glory is identified with Him taking up His glorious throne of the Cross, fulfilling His mission as the "Lamb of God" Who offers His life for the salvation of all, and pouring forth His grace and mercy from His wounded side.

Reflect, today, upon this, the first of Jesus' signs. Try to meditate upon this story as a way of preparing yourself to receive His grace more fully in your life. Think of the superabundance of the miracle and ponder the fact that it points to the superabundance of grace God wants to give you. Reflect, also, upon the fact that it took place by the intercession of Jesus' dear mother. She also will anticipate your needs and pray for you with her motherly heart. Ponder the beautiful meaning and symbolism in this passage so that you will more fully share in God's abundant glory.

*My glorious Lord, Your entire earthly life
was a preparation for the hour in which You gave Your life
as a sacrifice on the Cross for the remission of sins.
Please continuously prepare me to receive You more fully and
to open my heart to You and all that You have bestowed upon
me through Your perfect sacrifice of love.*

Jesus, I trust in You.

JANUARY DEVOTIONS

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to certain devotion. **The month of January is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus.**

"In the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth and under the earth" (Phil 2:10). Christ's name is chosen in heaven, and the Angel Gabriel announces it when he informs the Blessed Virgin of the incarnation: "Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus". It is a name that has marvelous implications, for it means "savior." The very name bespeaks the magnitude of His mission, His infinite love, a love that will cause Him to offer Himself up for us.

The name of Jesus is the sweetest of all names, and He who bears it is most worthy of all love. He who calls Jesus his friend can be assured that this friend is the most devoted and unselfish of all friends.

Jesus is our all. In His name we may pray to the Father with assurance of being heard. In His name the Church administers all her sacraments. In His name she offers all her prayers and blesses homes, the fields, and the sick. In the name of Jesus she casts out evil spirits, and at the hour of our death bids us, "Go forth, Christian soul." She assures us that whoever shall call upon this name will be saved. When our soul has departed this life to seek its eternal home, the Church asks in the name of Jesus, "Eternal rest give unto him, O Lord." — Benedict Baur, O.S.B.

THEMES FOR THE 2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C

The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C highlights the importance of recognizing God's work in our lives. The readings emphasize the joy, unity, and gifts we receive from God.

God's Promise of Joy: Isaiah speaks of Jerusalem's new name and joy. This joy is a sign of God's love and faithfulness.

Gifts of the Holy Spirit: Paul explains that the Holy Spirit gives different gifts to different people. These gifts are for the good of the community.

Unity in Diversity: Paul teaches that though there are many different gifts, they come from the same Spirit. This shows the importance of unity in the Church.

Transformation through Christ: The wedding at Cana in John's Gospel shows Jesus turning water into wine. This miracle is a sign of Jesus' power and care for others.

The Role of Mary: At the wedding in Cana, Mary notices the need for wine and asks Jesus to help. Her role shows her care and faith in Jesus. She also acts as an intercessor for us.

Celebration of Marriage: The wedding feast in Cana reminds us of the importance of marriage. It highlights marriage as a joyous celebration and a sign of God's presence.

The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C helps us see how God is present in our lives. It encourages us to use our gifts and celebrate the joy and unity God brings.

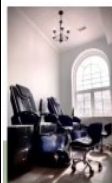
