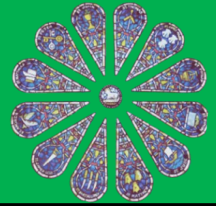

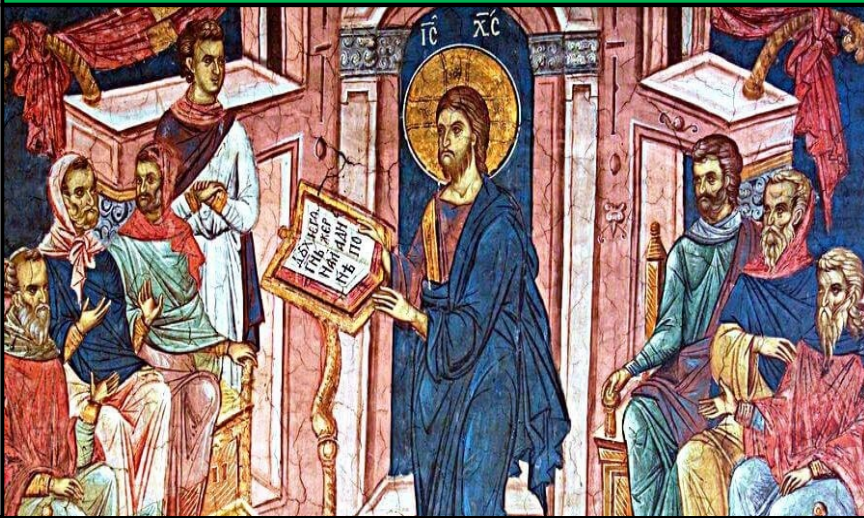

WORD OF GOD SUNDAY

Observed on The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C - January 26th, 2025



First Reading - Nehemiah 8:2-4a,5-6,8-10

Ezra reads the law to the people from morning until noon. The assembly responds with worship and tears, and Nehemiah encourages celebration and sharing, emphasizing joy in the LORD.

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 19:8,9,10,15

The LORD's laws refresh and guide the soul, bringing joy and wisdom. His enduring commands foster a deep reverence that pleases Him.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 12:12-30

Christ's body, like a human body, consists of many parts, each unique and essential. Unity and diversity coexist, emphasizing mutual respect and shared responsibilities among all members.

Gospel Reading - Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Jesus returns to Galilee, teaches widely, and in Nazareth, reads from Isaiah, announcing the fulfillment of the prophecy, emphasizing his mission to liberate and heal, witnessed by his hometown.

WORD OF GOD SUNDAY


Observed on The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C - January 26th, 2025

The 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C emphasizes the call to ministry and the significance of scripture. The readings highlight the teaching and interpretation of the law, the unity of believers as parts of the body of Christ, and Jesus' public ministry as He proclaims the fulfillment of scripture. Key themes include the sacrament of Holy Orders, the universal priesthood of believers, the importance of scripture study and knowledge, fostering a sense of community, and reaching out to those who feel excluded.

Gospel Acclamation: Cf. Luke 4:18 The Lord sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor, and to proclaim liberty to captives.

Enthused by the Gospel:

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. Luke 4:14-15

This Gospel passage reveals to us the very beginnings of Jesus' public ministry. He began His public ministry immediately after spending forty days in the desert being tempted by the devil. As He began, He went to Galilee "in the power of the Spirit." Many people heard about Him and welcomed Him with much enthusiasm.

Though Jesus was initially welcomed with praise, we know that things quickly changed. Some eventually became so hostile that they put Jesus to death, but it's useful to ponder the initial response He received. This initial response is one that must become continuously new in our lives. The initial response was that He "was praised by all."

Reflect, today, upon the fact that God wants us to continuously experience the Gospel as something new and transforming. The newness of the life of grace must never wear off. Ponder this experience in your life and try to see yourself as one of the people in today's Gospel who heard Jesus for the first time. Ponder their enthusiasm and join in their praise of our Lord so that you will be motivated to let God and the preaching of His holy Word continuously transform you.

JANUARY DEVOTIONS

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to certain devotion. **The month of January is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus.**

"In the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth and under the earth" (Phil 2:10). Christ's name is chosen in heaven, and the Angel Gabriel announces it when he informs the Blessed Virgin of the incarnation: "Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus". It is a name that has marvelous implications, for it means "savior." The very name bespeaks the magnitude of His mission, His infinite love, a love that will cause Him to offer Himself up for us.

The name of Jesus is the sweetest of all names, and He who bears it is most worthy of all love. He who calls Jesus his friend can be assured that this friend is the most devoted and unselfish of all friends.

Jesus is our all. In His name we may pray to the Father with assurance of being heard. In His name the Church administers all her sacraments. In His name she offers all her prayers and blesses homes, the fields, and the sick. In the name of Jesus she casts out evil spirits, and at the hour of our death bids us, "Go forth, Christian soul." She assures us that whoever shall call upon this name will be saved. When our soul has departed this life to seek its eternal home, the Church asks in the name of Jesus, "Eternal rest give unto him, O Lord." — Benedict Baur, O.S.B.

THEMES FOR THE 3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C

The readings for the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C bring important themes to our faith. These themes help us understand God's word and how it guides our lives.

Importance of Scripture: Nehemiah shows the people the importance of listening to God's word. Reading and understanding Scripture brings joy and strength.

Unity in the Body of Christ: Paul talks about how every part of the body is important. This means every person in the Church is valuable and has a role.

Joy in the Lord: Nehemiah reminds the people not to be sad but to rejoice in the Lord. Our strength comes from the joy we find in God.

Jesus Fulfills Prophecy: In the Gospel, Jesus reads from Isaiah and says He fulfills this prophecy. This shows us Jesus is the promised Savior.

Mission of Jesus: Jesus explains His mission to bring good news to the poor and freedom to the oppressed. He came to help and save everyone.

Hearing and Doing: The readings encourage us to not just hear God's word but to act on it. We should live out our faith every day.

Community Worship: Nehemiah gathers all people to hear God's word. Worshipping together strengthens our faith and community.

Empowerment by the Spirit: Jesus starts His mission filled with the Holy Spirit. The Spirit helps us live out our mission too.

These themes show us the power of God's word and the importance of our role in the Church. They remind us to find joy in the Lord and to live out our faith together.

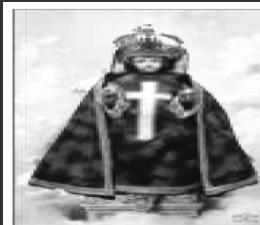

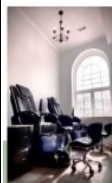
