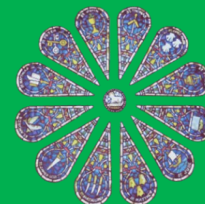

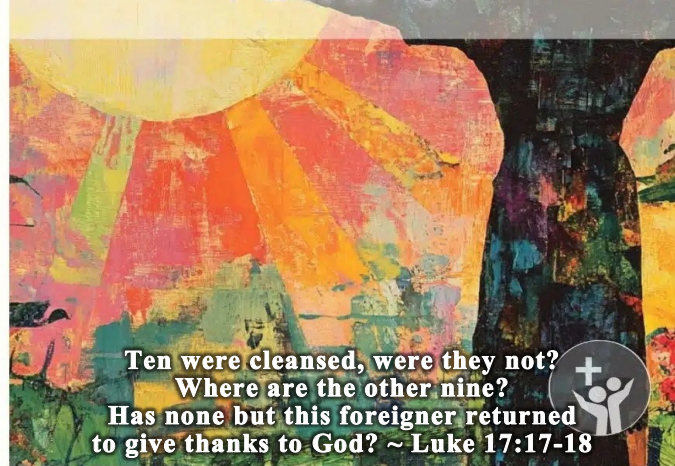

28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C



Ten were cleansed, were they not?
Where are the other nine?
Has none but this foreigner returned
to give thanks to God? ~ Luke 17:17-18

First Reading - 2 Kings 5:14-17

Naaman was healed of leprosy after obeying Elisha's instruction. He acknowledged the God of Israel and vowed to worship only Him. Elisha refused Naaman's gift.

The Lord has shown his saving power and justice to all nations. Sing a new song and praise him for his wonderful deeds and faithfulness.

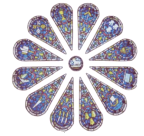

Praying for More than Our Needs:

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him. They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" ~ Luke 17:11-13

This story begins very well for all ten of these lepers. For nine of them, it ends tragically. For one, it ends in an even better and more glorious way than it began.

The lepers represent us all. Their illness was a symbol of all sin and the consequences of sin. When the disease began, the lepers began to experience the effects of their disease. Discolored and thick dry skin, sores, and rashes would set in. Once detected, each leper was removed from the community to stop the spread of the disease and was only free to associate with other lepers. They no longer could gather freely with their loved ones as the lepers entered isolation and shame. Analogously, all sin has similar effects. Sin causes pain within our souls as we discover the growing wounds it causes. Sin affects our relationships and our ability to freely relate to those whom we love.

Reflect, today, upon the ways in which you turn to God in prayer. It is good to come to Him with your needs and problems. It is good to cry out "Jesus, Master! Have pity on me!" It is good to come to Him as the Physician of your soul and the source of healing you need. But that is not enough. In fact, if you stop there in your life of prayer, you will end in a most miserable state. You will be using God for your selfish advantage. Reflect upon whether you are able to take the next and most important step in faith. Do you come to Him when all is well? Do you praise Him with all your might for all that He has done for you? Do you fall on your knees before Him with the deepest gratitude in your heart? Reflect upon your prayer and seek to imitate this one leper. If you do, your faith will also save you and our Lord will invite you to rise and go forth, healed in the truest way possible.

Most merciful Lord, You are able to do all things. You are able to heal all my wounds, forgive my sins and solve every problem I encounter. As I cry out to You in my need, please do heal me. In response, may I always turn back to You with the deepest gratitude and praise so that my faith in You will grow and my love for You will truly flourish. Jesus, I trust in You.

THEMES FOR THE 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

The readings for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C talk about healing, faith, and gratitude. They show how people respond to God's help and how faith brings wholeness.

Healing comes from God: Naaman is healed of leprosy after following God's instruction. Jesus heals ten lepers, showing that God brings both physical and spiritual healing.

Faith leads to healing: Naaman at first doubts but then obeys and is healed. The Samaritan leper trusts Jesus, returns to give thanks, and is told his faith has saved him.

Gratitude is important: Naaman returns to thank Elisha after being healed. Only one of the ten lepers thanks Jesus, showing that many forget to be grateful.

God's mercy is for all: Naaman is not an Israelite, but God still heals him. The one grateful leper is a Samaritan, showing that God's love is for everyone.

Hardship and faith: Paul suffers for preaching about Jesus, but he stays faithful. He reminds others that suffering for Christ leads to glory with him.

Jesus is always faithful: Paul says that even when people fail, Jesus remains true. Jesus heals even those who do not return to thank him.

The readings for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C teach about faith and gratitude. They remind people to trust in God and to give thanks for his blessings.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM PRAYING FOR THE UNBORN AND THEIR FAMILIES

Starting in October (Pro-Life Month), the I am asking you and your family to do something very simple, yet Very Powerful. We are asking you all to promise to pray daily for 9 months a baby who might not otherwise make it to birth. This was the idea of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen and is called Spiritual Adoption. Our focus will be on the Power of Prayer to help babies and their families.

The prayer may be prayed in the morning, in the evening, or whenever it is convenient for you and your family. Please also give a name to the baby for whom you are praying to make it more personal. You may not know who this baby is, but God does, and I'm sure you will one day meet in heaven. You can do this individually, or this would be great to do as a family.

Many parents have experienced the loss of a child before birth, due to a miscarriage, or an abortion. We are asking you to pray a child to birth ~ asking God for the health and safety of the baby, and to give the parents of these children the grace they need to face whatever difficult circumstances in which they may find themselves.

This is the Spiritual Adoption Prayer to pray daily:

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much.
I beg you to protect the baby in its mother's womb, especially _____,
whom I have spiritually adopted.

Please give the parents of this child the help they need to keep their baby strong and healthy. Amen.
